| <b><u>biped</u></b>   |                |   |
| an animal that walks on two feet  | Noun           | A biped has two feet.   |
| <b><u>centipede</u></b>   |                |   |
| a creature with 100 feet  | Noun           | A wormlike centipede has 100 tiny legs.                       |
| <b><u>impediment</u></b>  |                |   |
| something that blocks or stands in one's way; an obstacle                   | Noun           | Laziness is a major impediment to success.                    |
| <b><u>millipede</u></b>   |                |   |
| a creature with 1000 feet   | Noun           | A millipede with 1000 legs crawled by.                        |
| <b><u>pedal</u></b>   |                |   |
| a lever that is moved with one's foot                                       | Noun           | I pressed my foot down on the gas pedal.                      |
| <b><u>peddler</u></b>   |                |   |
| a person who goes from door to door on foot trying to sell something        | Noun           | A peddler came by the house to sell watches.                  |
| <b><u>pedestrian</u></b>  |                |   |
| a person who walks across the street on foot; a person who travels on foot  | Noun           | The tall pedestrian walked across the street.                 |
| <b><u>pedicure</u></b>  |                |   |
| a foot treatment that could include soaking the feet and polishing toenails | Noun           | The lady in the salon painted my toenails during my pedicure. |
| <b><u>quadruped</u></b>   |                |   |
| an animal having four feet  | Noun           | The quadruped is four-footed.                                 |
| <b><u>tripod</u></b>  |                |   |
| three-legged stand or base, often for a camera                              | Noun           | The standing tripod keeps the camera steady.                  |
